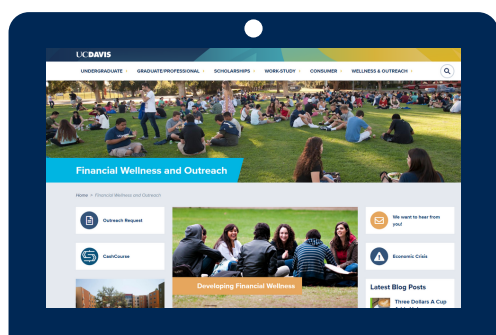

*The estimated Cost of Attendance (COA) is an average figure used to determine financial aid eligibility. It includes average amounts for standard expenses, some of which are owed to the University (such as Tuition and Fees), and some of which students and their families will pay on their own (Off-Campus and Commuter Room & Board, Personal Expenses and Transportation). The amount a student pays directly to the University depends on their residency and housing status as well as whether they use the UC Davis Student Health Insurance Plan (SHIP). Nonresident students will have the same costs as an On-Campus student with the addition of \$28,992 for nonresident supplemental tuition.

- **How Much Am I Spending Calculator:** To help determine what you could accumulate by reducing or eliminating expenses.

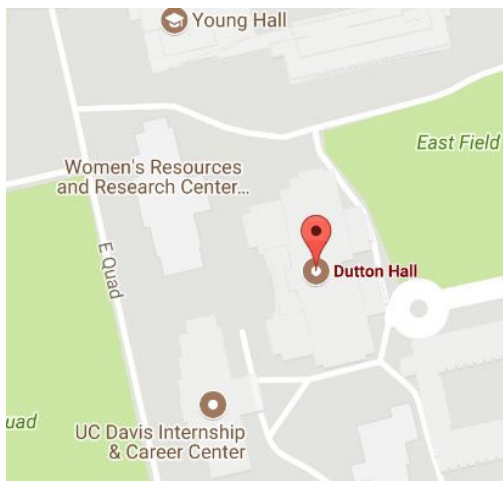
TIPS TO REMEMBER

PLAN AHEAD

- Plan ahead for possible expenses like the lease application fee, credit check fee, security deposit, first month's rent, and last month's rent deposit that will be due prior to receiving your financial aid check. Please note that you will be signing a 12-month lease but your financial aid package will cover the 9-month academic year.
- Shop early for housing! January - March is the best time to finalize an apartment.
- Utilize free resources such as Unitrans, and get to know the bus routes. 15-20 min. away from campus is not that far.
- Know what you want: Cheap rent, near campus, 1-2 roommates etc.
- Plan to complete your FAFSA or CA Dream Act Application before March 2. If you need assistance, help will be available at one of the FAFSA/CA Dream Act Application Nights in February.




CHECK REQUIREMENTS

Ensure that there are no incomplete requirements in MyAwards to ensure timely disbursement of your Financial Aid.
