 ✓ Donate gently used items to the <u>Aggie Reuse</u> <u>Store</u> or a local thrift store.


eWaste & Household Hazardous Waste

✓ Visit <u>facilities.ucdavis.edu/utilities/solid-waste</u>

Bulky Items (furniture, mattresses, etc.)

- If an item cannot be donated, it can be taken to the <u>Yolo County Landfill</u> (fee may be imposed depending on the item).
- ✓ Do not leave in waste enclosure.

Containers must be emptied of liquid and food residue

- ✓ Aluminum, steel, & tin cans
- ✓ Glass bottles & jars
- ✓ White & colored paper
- ✓ Magazines & newspapers
- ✓ Paperboard (e.g. Cereal box)
- \checkmark Plastic containers identified with



Compost

- ✓ Liquid & food waste
- ✓ Compostable paper cups & food containers
- ✓ Compostable plastic & wood utensils
- ✓ Food soiled pizza boxes
- \checkmark Compostable plastic containers identified with

Reusables

Gently used:

- ✓ School supplies
- ✓ Books
- ✓ Clothing & accessories
- ✓ Art & craft materials
- ✓ Small working electronics
- \checkmark Check with your local thrift store for a complete list

Landfill

- ✓ Packing Foam/Styrofoam™identified with
- ✓ Plastic bags & film
- ✓ Food wrappers
- ✓ Plastic utensils & straws
- ✓ Soup & beverage cartons
- ✓ Empty aerosol cans

Electronic Waste (eWaste)

- ✓ Batteries
- ✓ Inkjet cartridges
- ✓ Cell phones & accessories
- ✓ Small non-working electronics

Household Hazardous Waste

- ✓ Non-empty aerosol cans
- ✓ Glues & adhesives
- ✓ Household cleaners
- ✓ Mercury thermometers
- ✓ Nail polish & remover
- ✓ Oil & latex paints
- ✓ Pharmaceuticals
- ✓ Solvents
- ✓ Syringes (containerized)
- ✓ Car fluids
- ✓ Unknown substances
